Tour the 1852 farmhouse, located on 140 acres, with costumed artisans demonstrating period skills like weaving, broom making, and blacksmithing. Bring a picnic to enjoy! Home of The Maryland Wine Festival® for over 40 years! **Go to page 11.**



Discover... our beautiful scenic backroads while driving our award-winning Barn Quilt Trail. Using the app or website, you can map out a route to view a few or see all 50 quilt blocks. The 8' by 8' quilt blocks include classic patterns as well as original designs created by the farm owners that tell a story about their family or their farming operation.

Immerse... yourself in history at the **Union Mills Homestead and Grist Mill** (circa 1797). Tour the home of six generations of the Shriver family who have lovingly maintained the Homestead and Grist Mill. In the days before the Gettysburg Civil War battle, troops from both North and South were fed from the huge kitchen—though on different days. Watch grain being made into wheat, buckwheat and corn meal. **Go to page 14.**

Explore... our charming countryside and continue your **Civil War** experience with the **“Roads to Gettysburg”** driving tour. This brochure takes you for a leisurely ride on some of our most scenic back roads while tracing the movements of over 60,000 Union and

Confederate troops from the southern end of the county north to Gettysburg. **Go to page 17.**

Stroll... our historic downtown **Main Streets**. Self-guided walking tours offer a fascinating look at historic architecture while you shop for the perfect souvenir or unique gift at a locally owned shop or boutique. Towns & Cities

Hampstead

Hampstead, a historic friendly community with a quintessentially classic Main Street, has grown quickly since the first stagecoach came to town in 1808 and has still retained its small-town charm and beauty. Several events are held in Hampstead annually: Hampstead Day (May), the Farmers Market (Saturdays, June- September), the Fireman's Carnival (August), and the Christmas Tree Lighting (November). The historic **Train Station**, originally constructed in 1912, is a museum showcasing Hampstead's history; the monumental **War Memorial** on Main Street honors veterans from World War I forward. Play a round of golf at **Oakmont Green** or take a walk in one of the restful parks. Dine at one of the many locally owned restaurants and enjoy a theatrical production in the auditorium of the **Coppermine PantherPlex**. Be sure to visit the charming downtown shops. Come and see why Hampstead was named "Best Place to Raise Children in Maryland" and "Safest Place to Live in Maryland"!



Manchester

The Town of Manchester dates to the 1760's and is famous for the Union Sixth Army Corps, which marched into Gettysburg, PA, under General Sedgwick. During the Civil War, thousands of troops were housed in or around the town. Manchester has maintained its small-town feel and boasts the most acres of municipal park land in Carroll County. Come explore 80 acres of fields, meadows, forests, trails and **Charlottes Quest Nature Center at Pine Valley Park**. Also in Manchester is **Christmas Tree Park**, a 41-acre park with picnic and family activity areas, including inclusive playground equipment. Visit Manchester's

Historical Center where artifacts related to Manchester's history of businesses, households, Civil War, Military Connections, organizations, and schools are displayed; and a research library is available to the public.

Mount Airy

Located in the heart of the Four County community, Mount Airy seamlessly blends its historic past with exciting new projects, fun community events and an abundance of locally owned and operated shops, restaurants



and businesses. The town flourished after the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad established a train stop along its Baltimore to Frederick line, running for more than a century. Today, folks can visit the historic train station reborn as the **Mount Airy Museum** which explores the town's rich history including agriculture and canning. Just steps away, guests will find a restored **B&O Railroad Caboose** serving as a welcome center for downtown Main Street. During the past decade, portions of the former railroad line have been converted into walking and biking paths. **Rails to Trails East** connects the 20-acre Watkins Park to downtown Main Street while **Rails to Trails West** is nestled in a residential neighborhood providing an opportunity for residents and visitors to step into nature.

New Windsor

Founded in 1797, over the years New Windsor has collected its fair share of fascinating characters and stories, all of which add to the special charm of this town. Discover for yourself the intrigue of the past through the unique lens of local history at the **New Windsor Heritage Museum** or through a self-guided walking tour of the historic town, including its Civil War heritage sites.



Sykesville

Historic Sykesville is proud of its Old Towne America flavor. Historically the commercial center of Sykesville, Main Street remains a vibrant and unique commercial district. Some of the downtown merchants include a bookstore, restaurants, a tearoom and contemporary jewelry and home décor boutiques. Exploring the history of the town, the **Gate House Museum** and the **Historic Colored Schoolhouse** provide an educational experience for all ages. The **Little Sykes Railway** operates a 12-gauge train that young children can actually ride. Adding to the sense of community in Sykesville is a summer Farmers Market and lots of events: Art and Wine Festival, Fallfest, Fall Concert series, Movies In The Park. Sykesville's preservation efforts, Main Street shopping and unique

events earned the town the honor of being named the **"2016 Coolest Small Town in America"** by Budget Travel. Stop by the **Old Main Line Post Office and Visitor Center** for more information on what there is to see and do.

Taneytown

Long before its founding in 1754, the Tuscarora Indians hunted the abundant woodlands in the Taneytown area. From its earliest days as a crossroads village, Taneytown grew into a linear town where homes, shops and public buildings lined the main streets in a walkable setting. Prosperity followed as Taneytown became a regional market town through the 19th and 20th centuries. Local builders and architects introduced popular styles of the time; many of which still give downtown its distinctive historic character. In 1986, the



Taneytown Historic District was added to the National Register of Historic Places, and preservation remains a point of pride for the community. Just minutes from Gettysburg, the **Taneytown History Museum** highlights the city's past and its role in the Civil War. Visitors can also enjoy the town's welcoming parks and seasonal celebrations like the **Taneytown Wine, Art & Music Festival**. Taneytown is also home to **Antrim 1844 Country House Hotel**. Renowned for its fine dining and luxurious accommodations, Antrim reflects the warmth, elegance, and hospitality that make Taneytown such a memorable destination.

Union Bridge

The gently rolling terrain of Union Bridge offers outstanding rural scenes at every turn in the road, while its small downtown boasts a proud heritage. The National Park Service has recognized Union Bridge for its wealth of historic buildings. Many of the buildings are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Plan to visit the **Western Maryland Railway Historical Society Museum**. As you stroll the streets and gaze at the historic buildings, imagine what it may have been like during the 1800's as a bustling center of commerce.

Westminster

Designated as a nationally accredited Main Street, downtown

Westminster provides a unique quality shopping, dining and cultural experience within a small town atmosphere, including many locally-owned restaurants that offer everything from fine regional cuisine to great ethnic food. During the summer, a "producers only" Farmers' Market offers locally grown produce, dairy, and other farm products. Downtown Westminster is home to many community events—**Flower and Jazz**

Festival, Art in the Park, FallFest, and wonderful parades—**Memorial Day** and the **Electric Holiday Parade**. Culturally, downtown Westminster is bookended by the **Carroll Arts Center** on West Main Street and the **Historical Society of Carroll County** on East Main Street – with walking tours available for all the historic sites in between. The rural areas surrounding downtown Westminster offer nature parks and historic sites such as **Union Mills Homestead and Grist Mill** and the **Carroll County Farm Museum**, where **The Maryland Wine Festival®** is held along with numerous other fun events.

The 140-acre property also offers numerous outdoor exhibits. Jack and Jim, our oxen, are here April through October along with other animals. The museum offers a farm-themed playground and picnic tables for family use. Children may also enjoy our Living History Camps each summer. Traditional arts classes including blacksmithing are also offered. Special events include The Maryland Wine Festival®, Carroll County’s biggest Fourth of July Celebration and Traditional Arts Festival. Our Reception Barn and pavilions are available for weddings, reunions, group picnics and other private gatherings.



Historical Society of Carroll County

The Historical Society campus includes three historic early 19th century buildings on East Main Street in the oldest part of Westminster. Start your visit in the Cockey's Tavern building (c. 1820), home of the research library and bookstore. Enjoy the exhibits in the Kimmey House (c. 1800) and take a tour of the fully restored Sherman-Fisher-Shellman House (1807). Discover what life was like for a prosperous Pennsylvania German tavernkeeper and his family, as well as seeing the new Mary Shellman – From Civil War to Suffrage exhibit. Be sure to stroll through the gardens and visit the four-square vegetable garden, herb garden, and dye garden. Visit the website for details about the current exhibits. Free parking in the rear.

Since 1997, the Gate House Museum has served as a free public history museum sharing the story of the Town of Sykesville. The Gate House Museum promotes the curiosity of Sykesville area visitors and residents through its collections, displays, and educational programs. Operated by the Town of Sykesville, the museum provides an overview of Sykesville area history from the early 1800's to present day with a focus on the foundations of the Town of Sykesville and our Historic District. Located inside the original gates (now part of Millard Cooper Park) of Springfield Hospital Center, our 1904 historic house celebrates community life, highlighting the experience of hospital employee and Gate House resident, William Shipley.

Union Mills Homestead and Grist Mill

A unique historic landmark, this 1790's estate includes the Homestead filled with original furnishings and family possessions belonging to six generations of the Shriver family. In addition, there are multiple outbuildings and a working grist mill, with demonstrations of grinding grain into flour by water power. The mill can produce stoneground whole wheat, buckwheat and cornmeal. The Homestead holds the Annual Flower and Plant Market, Civil War Encampment, Annual Corn

Self-guided Walking Tours

History buffs can find plenty to satisfy their curiosity. Many of our small towns offer informative walking tours based on architectural building style while also providing some historic information about the site. (Free brochures are available through the Visitor Center at 800-272-1933 or on the website www.CarrollCountyTourism.org.)

New Windsor

The town of New Windsor was laid out and surveyed in 1797 by Isaac Atlee. He opened an inn and tavern at the corner of Main and High Streets. The town prospered partially thanks to a military road which supplied the town with considerable commercial activity. As in many small towns, the railroad provided more business activity. In 1863, the town saw over 5,000 Union cavalry ride through on their way to the Battle of Gettysburg. Today, visitors may view the exteriors of elegant stately homes at the top of Church Street formerly called "Quality Hill." Various types of architecture may be seen: Colonial Revival, Classical Revival, Queen Anne and Bungalow styles.

Sykesville

In 1825, James Sykes purchased the first of many land parcels, totaling over 800 acres, and a small English-style mill village sprang to life. In the 1830's, the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad carved through the town, and Sykesville became a bustling stop. With a devastating flood in 1868, much of the early town was washed away. Residents rebuilt on the north side of the Patapsco in Carroll County, the present day location. The self-guided walking tour brochure takes visitors down Main Street and beyond, past well-preserved buildings including the Queen Anne-style railroad station built in 1884, the Sykesville Gate House Museum and the historic one-room Colored Schoolhouse.

Taneytown

In 1744 John Diggs gave a 60-acre tract to his son Edward and son-in-law Raphael Taney. After "growing" the tract to include 7,900 acres, Taney laid out lots and named the future town "Taneytown." The town center formed a crossroads from Baltimore through Westminster to Taneytown. Well-to-do merchants and craftsmen built houses that still stand today. This tour will introduce you to some history of the previous owners and the architectural styles of several eras.

Union Bridge

In 1861, growth in this quaint town was fueled by the arrival of

the Western Maryland Railroad. William and Ann Farquhar settled here in 1735 when William's father granted him 200 acres. Many of the settlers were Quakers. William's grandson named the town "Union Bridge" when local area citizens banded together to build a bridge over a local swamp. The National Park Service has recognized Union Bridge for its wealth of historic buildings. Many of the buildings are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.


Civil War History

The rich farmland of Carroll County skirts the Mason-Dixon Line, denoting North from South. Picturesque and serene, this pivotal county remained relatively unscathed during the two years the Civil War raged here.

Union commanders were aware of the strategic value of this rolling farmland. The recently completed Western Maryland Railroad's depot in Westminster meant much needed supplies could come in from Washington and Baltimore. The Union Army of the Potomac set up its rail head and supply base in Westminster where it remained during the course of the war. Supply lines were established and guarded; residents became accustomed to Union troops and supply wagons in and around their once peaceful town.

With Confederate troops converging from the north and west, Major General George G. Meade, Commander of the Army of the Potomac, developed a plan to protect Baltimore and Washington. If the Confederate Army moved south, the "Pipe Creek Plan" would create a defensive shield behind Pipe Creek, which flows west across Carroll County. Meade's army began moving northeast from Frederick to position troops in the hills outside Manchester, as described in the "Pipe Creek Plan." Though they didn't know yet, these soldiers were marching on the roads to Gettysburg.

Downtown Westminster, the Farm Museum and Union Mills Homestead and Grist Mill present reenactments of these events throughout the year.



Civil War Driving and Walking Tours

Carroll County's involvement in the Civil War can be traced through walking and driving tours with stops at the sites of skirmishes and troop encampments as both the Union and Confederate armies made their way to and from the Battle of Gettysburg.



There are two **driving tours** to help navigate the county. The first tour, "**Carroll County, Maryland: Roads to Gettysburg**," helps the visitor to navigate the movements

of over 60,000 troops from the southern end of the county up to Gettysburg. The second tour, "**Gettysburg: Invasion and Retreat**," is a much broader look at the June-July 1863 Campaign including surrounding counties. This map guides the visitor along the armies' paths, stopping at 19 markers with illustrations, photos, and interesting stories about the impact of the War on local citizens and the day-to-day stories of soldiers who marched toward the epic Gettysburg battle. Follow the bugle trailblazer signs to the 19 wayside markers.

The 1864 Campaign also brought troops through Carroll County, stopping in New Windsor and

Westminster. This troop movement is described on three wayside markers (one in New Windsor and two in Westminster).

In addition to the two driving tours, the visitor may experience the Civil War through a **self-guided walking tour**, "**Corbit's Charge**," on the Main Street of downtown Westminster. This walking tour, written by Tom LeGore, provides the background of "a small, but extremely important cavalry skirmish which took place in Westminster on June 29, 1863. The clash on the edge of town between General J.E.B. Stuart's cavalry and a small unit of the Delaware cavalry was a significant factor in slowing down the General's march. Instead of proceeding into Pennsylvania to inform General Robert E. Lee about the major Union troop movements, Stuart's cavalry was delayed long enough to make it advisable to spend the night in the Westminster area. Historians have often wondered whether the

results of the Battle of Gettysburg might have been different if Stuart had arrived before July 2nd."

Maryland Heritage Area— Heart of the Civil War Heritage Area



As part of our efforts to tell the Civil War story in context, Carroll County has partnered with Frederick and Washington Counties (to our west) to form one of Maryland's Heritage Areas: the Heart of the Civil War Heritage Area (HCWHA). These three counties contain stories of families torn apart as sons went off to war to fight for their beliefs. Many of the buildings are still standing today where South met North. With the HCWHA brochure, visitors can explore the three counties discovering the full impact the Civil War had, not only on this region, but on the entire nation. 
